<u>The Next Step in the Stratton School Garden</u>

Last year, the previous Garden Coordinator held a very successful fund raiser to build an outdoor classroom pavilion and an orchard. We reached out to ReTreeUs and our application was accepted for a school orchard.

Due to unforeseen circumstances, the orchard that was planned to be put in the spring of 2024, is postponed to the spring of 2025. Here is the timeline for the completion of the next step in the Stratton School Garden:

Fall 2024: Buy fence posts, fencing, dig holes and build doors. Get the fence installed.

Fall 2024: Final design for the outdoor classroom pavilion, bring to the school board for approval to begin building.

Spring 2025: ReTreeUs comes to the school and plants the apple orchard.

Spring 2025: The pavilion is built for teachers and students to use before the end of the school year.
